

The Lord Is Exalted
Isaiah 33:1-6

- I. The Promised Overthrow of the “Destroyer” (1)
 - A. Assyria, Egypt, etc. as types and pictures of “antichrist” and Satan
 - B. The picture of humanity’s great enemy and the one viewed as the “god of this world”
 - C. Cf. – Mark 4:15; Luke 22:31; John 8:44; 1 Corinthians 5:5; Ephesians 6:11; 1 Timothy 3:6-7; 1 Peter 5:8
- II. A Plea For Grace & Salvation (2-4)
 - A. Gracious – to show favor and/or compassion
 - 1. Waited – hoped for, longed for
 - 2. Strength – emphasis on strength to fight (the destroyer)
 - 3. Salvation – deliverance, victory
 - B. Overthrow the enemy – As Promised!
 - 1. Best way to pray – for something God has already promised to do
 - 2. Best way to live – in faith that God will keep His Word
- III. Who The Lord Is And What He Does (5-6)
 - A. The Lord is:
 - 1. Exalted – higher in rank
 - 2. He dwells on high – “enthroned above us”
 - 3. Fills Zion with justice and righteousness
 - 4. Stability in unstable times
 - 5. A wealth of salvation
 - 6. A wealth of wisdom and knowledge
 - B. Man responds
 - 1. By fearing the Lord
 - 2. By having that fear cause the Lord to become man’s treasure
