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Exodus 25 verses 1 through 9. These are God's words, then Yahweh spoke to Moses saying, speak to the children of Israel, that they bring me an offering from everyone who gives it willingly with its heart.

You shall take my offering and this is the offering which you shall take from them, gold silver, bronze blue, purple, and scarlet, thread, fine, linen and goat's hair rams, skins dyed, red badger skins and acacia wood oil for the light and spices for the anointing oil. And for the sweet and sense, Onyx stones, and stones to be set on the ephed and in the breastplate.

And let them make me a sanctuary. That I may dwell among them according to all that, I show you that as the pattern of the tabernacle and the pattern of all its furnishings. Just so You shall make it So far. The reading of God's inspired and inherent tort We've been amazed the last couple of weeks and Exodus chapter 24 as the Lord brought His people near and they didn't die.

They saw the Lord. And they ate and they drank. And then all the more amazed that as the glory cloud descended upon the mountain. Moses was brought not just to the edge of the glory cloud where he was for the six days. But on the seventh day, he was cold to from within the glory cloud and entered into the midst of it, and the nearness into, which the Lord brought his servant and the greatness of the glory to which he brought his servant so near and then being instructed by the rest of the scripture that we have come nearer still to greater display of glory still in our union with Jesus Christ.

And in these assemblies. Well there is an amazement that that we have highlighted especially in verse 8 as God in whose glory cloud, Moses stands says to him. Let them make me a sanctuary. A place of of holiness that I may dwell among them that this God. And in the midst of whose glory, he stands is now saying that this is not a one-time event for one man.

Certainly this particular display at this particular place and the giving of the instructions is one time but he's telling Moses that this glorious God is going to come and dwell among his people by means of the structure that Moses is. Now receiving instruction for how to build here. Comes then instructions for the persistence of God's nearness to His people.

Here comes instructions for the persistence of this great glory of God. In the midst of his people. Instructions, of course that anticipate being obsoleted by Christ as we will consider, especially when we get to verse 9 and this pattern that was given to him on the mountain that as marvelous as the pattern was yet.

It was only a shadow copy of the true. And heavenly thing, which is our Lord, Jesus himself who has not just Tabernacled among us. But in whom now we enter the holy of holies in glory and the greatness of that which that which can obsolete the tabernacle, which is, of course, the Lord Jesus himself.

And as he gives instructions for the, the persistence of this nearness, and the persistence of this glory, in the midst of Israel, We notice three things in particular, which we aim. Now, to consider under these headings prescription provision and pattern prescription, the fact that the

Lord is the one who is giving the exact design, the exact instructions provision that for the building, for the constructing of what the Lord designs.

The Lord himself has provided and pattern that God actually makes Moses to see the shape of these things. Not only giving him then a pattern on the mountain. But as Hebrews further instructs us that we should have been able to glean from this and were thankful for the spirit's own interpretation of his word.

Not only is there a pattern given on the mountain for the construction but the tabernacle itself is meant to communicate something about that. Heavenly reality that at the time of the book of Hebrews has then been constructed in Christ. First then prescription then. Yahweh spoke to Moses saying, speak to the children of Israel.

So this is something that Yahweh is speaking now, but that you always has also written. If you look back at verse 12 of chapter 24, the Lord said to Moses, come up to me on the mountain and be there and I will give you tablets of stone and the law and commandments which I have written that you may teach them.

And so there are the tablets with a copy each of the Ten Commandments on them, that which the Lord will in the next passage. Call the testimony that which gets put in the arc and therefore, he even calls the arc in next Lord's. Day's passage the ark of the testimony but there's also these laws and commandments that Moses will teach to the children of Israel.

And so we have that as it were ringing in our ears or still resounding echoing in our ears when we get to chapter 25 verse 1 and verse 2, you always spoke to Moses saying speak to the children of Israel that they. And so, this is something that Moses has a written copy of and that Moses speaks.

And that we have now written for us. The Lord has strongly emphasized that. He's the one who is giving this revelation. He is the one who is giving who is giving this instruction and we're grateful for that because we do not have access to the heavenly things. And we do not have liberty with the corruption of our minds to decide how to engage the Lord in heaven.

We don't have the ability as it were to ascend into heaven, which is to bring Christ down, or to descend into the abyss, which is to bring Christ up from the dead. But the Lord, who does these things, He gives us His Word that we may believe all that.

He teaches us and obey. All that. He commands us, It's miraculous that through the book of the Covenant, and through the testimony, and through the law on the commandments, and through the tabernacle, and especially through the blood of the covenant, which has been poured on that altar and poured upon the people.

It is a miracle that only God can can do, can perform can accomplish that his people come near and not just safety. But blessing and if this was true at the time on the mountain that everything had to be according to all that the Lord shows him just so shall you make it?

Then this has not, this is not gone away when the blood is now the actual shed blood once for all of the Lord Jesus. And this is not going away when the glory is the glory of the only begotten Son, full of grace. And and truth. There's a how much more here If they could only approach the Lord in the way that the Lord had prescribed.

Then when when the blood that was spilled was bulls and goats. And the glory that was displayed was an anticipatory Gloria shadow and copy glory. How much more now when the blood that has been spilled is the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ and the glory is the true glory.

The final and full display of him who is the exact imprint of His nature and the brightness of his glory and sits on the throne, which these golden cherubim hammered into with one work. With the mercy seats will hear about next week was just a copy. The Lord has prescribed for us the worship that Christ leads from heaven.

What a great blessing Sometimes. Even just now at the lunch, there was a question about how the first day of the week came to be chosen and I put it that way because it wasn't asked quite that way. It was asked, how did men decide in the answer is, they didn't the Lord decided and as you begin to explain from the Scripture, how the Lord is, the one who has chosen the first day of the week.

Or another conversation is how you when you start to explain to someone who already believes in Jesus, he already accepts the New Testament, as the very words of God, but then you start to show them. How first Corinthians 14? Those who had the gift of prophecy, one of their duties was to acknowledge that apostles like Paul.

When the scripture was written, were writing under inspiration of the Holy Spirit and that Paul recognized the gospel of Luke, as scripture, quoting it to scripture to Timothy and that Peter, referred to the writings of Paul as Scripture and they suddenly are delivered. From the idea that man is the one who came up with the canon of the New Testament.

And you know all of that internet theology, rubbish that people come away with with Constantine as the one who decided or who called the assembly at, which it was finally decided or something like that. The Lord has prescribed for us. It's the Lord who picked the day is the Lord, who identified, the books of the New Testament to his people in real time by his spirit.

And now we're reminded as the Lord who prescribed, the construction of the Tabernacle for his people and the worship that they would have there. And we still have this blessed. How much more? It's the Lord who has prescribed the worship on earth that Christ leads from heaven. He of course, is not just the Lord of the Sabbath and the word from all eternity who was God and was with God and who has now become flesh and dwelt among us, It's his spirit by whom the prophets prophesied.

First Peter, 1 tells us it's his spirit who carried men along so that they didn't speak from themselves. But they spoke from God. Second Peter, chapter 1 tells us and so it's also the Lord Jesus himself. Who is prescribing this anticipatory worship. This anticipatory place of worship. The tabernacle to Moses on the mountain for the people of Israel in anticipation of and prospect of when he himself the true and final tabernacle would become flesh and tabernacle among us, and he would offer himself a sacrifice and he would consecrate our worship by his own blood as our priest.

And then he would rise again and ascend to the throne of glory so that this throne of grace that is made out of the mercy seat. And the cherubim is actually a, If we can put it this way, reverently cheap imitation, by comparison to what the throne of Heaven is now with Christ.

Our mercy seat sitting upon it as Hebrews teachers and we look forward to considering next week. What a marvelous generous gift? Indeed, when we think of it, as the gift of Jesus himself, as the one in whom we worship, in whom God has given himself to us in. Whom He brings us to Himself.

We call it the indescribable gift and suddenly the regular principle is not dusty or snickety theologizing, it is the embracing and embracing of and rejoicing over the glorious fact that God

has prescribed for us. That Christ himself has prescribed for us the worship that he leads. And that's what we want to do and nothing else.

According to the pattern that he has shown us, not now on a mountain but inscribed on the pages of his word We shall do. And just so we shall do it. So that is prescription and verse 1 2 and most of verse 9 there. There's also provision here In order to do this constructing.

There are a lot of materials needed, but even beyond the materials, there's something else that is much more difficult for an Israelite to come up with that is needed. And the more difficult thing for an Israelite to provide even then dolphin skins in the wilderness and its dolphin. Not badger.

It's a rare word. It's, it's difficult only in the, the discovery of other ancient news and texts and cognate words. Have we been able to to understand that that which was thought badger in the 16th century is actually dolphin and it makes sense. It's a waterproof covering it becomes the the last outer covering for the tabernacle, but even more difficult to obtain than dolphin skins in the wilderness is a willing heart.

In an Israelite verse 2 is marvelous. Here are these these extraordinarily rare and valuable things blue. Purple scarlet. Fine, linen Code goat's hair isn't. That difficult Ramskins. Died. Red dolphin, skins and occasion would, which will consider next week, especially in the construction of the ark, a very difficult, rare valuable.

Here they are in the middle of the wilderness and if an Israelite has one of these things and he's gonna give it but his heart isn't in. It verse 2 says, don't take it from him, Only accept the things that are willingly given from the heart. And so we see that the greater provision.

Here isn't just these treasures. The greater provision is that God, who has already been putting up with a great amount of rebellious, grumbling from these Israelites in the wilderness is going to for the purposes of the construction of his tabernacle. Give them cheerful willing hearts, to bring so much that he's going to have to subsequently given instruction to stop accepting.

The free will offerings because there's more than enough being given all the provision of our God is not just provision and material things but especially the gracious provision of the heart. Now, these are rare and valuable things in the wilderness, and how is it? How is it that they have gold, silver, bronze, blue, purple, and scarlet, thread, etc.

Even these the dolphin skins and the rare spices and for the anointing oil and How is it that they have all these things. Well, the Lord had planned to give his people. The treasures of Egypt. God has been collecting in Egypt for centuries. At this point, the treasures of the world.

The Egypt was the great power, they would conquer. They would They would bring in great treasure. And at the point where Israel wasn't even hoping, yet that they could even be delivered, They were just crying out and not necessarily to Yahweh, although it had come up to Yahweh. The Lord tells Moses that the bush In chapter 3, I will stretch out my hand and strike Egypt, and with all my wonders, I will do in my wits mitt do in its midst and after that, he will let you go.

And I will give this people favor in the sight of the Egyptians and it shall be when you go, you shall not go empty-handed. But every woman she'll ask of her neighbor, namely of her who dwells near her house articles of silver, articles of gold and clothing, you should put them on your sons and your daughters.

So, you shall plunder the Egyptians, and then when he starts to give preliminary instructions for the 10th plague, the death of the firstborn chapter 11 verse 2 speak. Now, in the hearing of the people, let everyone ask every man ask from his neighbor and every woman for her name from her neighbor, Articles of silver and articles of gold and Yahweh gave the people favor in the side of the Egyptian of the Egyptians.

Moreover, the man was very great in their eyes, etc. And then in the next chapter, when it actually happens in chapter 12 verse 35 and 36. Now, the children of Israel had done according to the word of Moses, and they had asked from the Egyptians articles of silver articles of Gold, and clothing, and Yahweh had given the people favor and sight in the sight of the Egyptians so that they granted them what they requested.

Thus, they plundered the Egyptians Now. Why had he given them to plunder the Egyptians, It wasn't merely to enrich them. In earthly things was the great reason. The great test reason for which they would have these treasures is so that they might in the wilderness at Sinai. Be able to construct this tabernacle.

That would anticipate the Lord. Jesus himself, becoming flesh being the one in whom we are gathered to God. And in whom God, dwells in the midst of his people similar to Noah and those those clean animals, Did they put Egyptian fabric on their sons and daughters where they clothed?

And where they furnished with with sandals that wouldn't wear out, which was miraculous, not just Egyptian, craftsmanship there, but a miracle, 40 years of wandering. They did those things, but the great blessing was they were able to give from the heart out of these treasures that the Lord had given them from Egypt that they might instruct a tabernacle just as the seven pairs of the clean animals, when Noah and his family get off, the boat makes them immediately free to enjoy this new command, this new gift and concession that they may eat the animals now and not just the plants as they had been given before.

And here they have seven pairs. But that wasn't the greatest reason for seven pairs of each of the clean animals. The greatest reason was so that they might have sacrifice for the worship of their God, who had redeemed them. And, and so it is here. So God provides willingness of heart.

He provides these rare and valuable things, so that we start to look at everything that God gives us in material, possessions, in time and ability and knowledge in the places that he puts us and we start to see his provision as assignment for his service. And we want to be as useful as possible not just an evangelism, but certainly that.

But especially for the worship of God, the proclamation of his gospel and the the parts of his worship. Even considering all of this verse 8 is the greatest. Provision of all, There is the willing heart, which is a miracle of God's grace and we rejoice over that as part of the gospel that God is the one even who gives regeneration God, is the one who gives even faith.

And then there's the provision that we see in verses 3 through, 7. But God himself as the greatest provision. He is the indescribable gift. And so you have even that language the world, the word became flesh and Tabernacled among us, John 1, 14. And then you get second Corinthians chapter 9 in which the apostle is urging the Corinthians to give for this collection for the Jews and he's urging them to do it with a willing heart, but in the context, one of the things that he highlights especially at the end of the chapter and God having given himself to us in Christ and that chapter concludes with thanks to God for his indescribable gift.

And verse 8 does function very much that way in our passage, doesn't it that as wonderful as the gold silver, precious stones etc in the wilderness is as more wonderful as a willing heart to give cheerfully is yet. God dwelling among his people, is the greater gift, the great test gift, the indescribable gift.

And so we look to God, to give us whatever earthly things are necessary. Whatever earthly things are useful for his service to give to us the willingness of heart to possess those things. Not tight fistedly and and begrudgingly. But eager not just to be a blessing to others. And in that way, that we were thinking about this morning and diagonal things, as we're going to progressively see is a demonstration of God's grace in his people, in the covenant of grace, but especially in in giving to facilitate the worship of God because We must have from God that grace to know him himself, His presence to us in Christ, by His Spirit, His power, His goodness to us in Christ by his spiritus, his own greatest provision And so there's prescription.

There's provision. Finally, there's pattern, we've already touched on this a little bit, the real what's translated in verse 9. All that I show you is a verb. It's actually the common verb for seeing but it's in a causative form participle here. Although that does not impact the meaning so much is understanding that this is say, if we're going to read it very kind of woodenly then all that I will cause you to see the that is according to all that I cause you to see that is the pattern of the tabernacle on the pattern of volts.

It's furnishings in the word pattern. Meaning a replica or a shape or a form that the Lord is, is, literally giving Moses a model here and an illustration. Whether it's part of that which is written like we were thinking about in verse 12 of chapter 24, or whether he causes Moses to see it in his mind but he causes Moses to see it.

Sometimes you run into people who are trying to do the culture transformation, sort of thing and they really want to, They really want to talk up, artistry and creativity. And it's fine to be creative and imitative of of what God has done. Not. Of course and in his worship.

But they'll try to say all the tabernacle is such an example of creativity. Well, It's an example of a man following the word instructions. According to the that image that was visibly shown to him. It was to be an exact copy of what the Lord has said. If you want to talk about creativity, talk about the Lord's creativity, that he was the one who devised.

What I couldn't see what ear couldn't hear what the heart of man could never have come up with that. The Lord of glory would be crucified and that by his blood, his church would be obtained. And then in in copy of that and invitation of that he created it was his creativity to give the tabernacle as a visual aid before the time a shadow for the time of the schoolmaster until we came of age until the church came of age and Christ came And so you have that language.

We won't take the time Now. We're we started a little bit late. We're beyond our usual time to look at Hebrews 8 and Hebrews 9, and how the true tabernacle is the incarnation. The true tabernacle is that which was in heaven at the time, that Hebrews is written with Jesus sitting in resurrected glory, leading, our worship from there and that this was something that was for Israel.

And for Judah, according to Hebrews, 8 verse 8, this one, covenant of grace, with the Lord, with the Lord Jesus Christ. And the final administration as the true tabernacle in heaven of which this earthly tent was a copy and this earthly tent would be consecrated and will be not too many chapters from now by the spilling of the blood of animals that's going to be splashed and sprinkled and poured out before various items and various things but glory of glorious.

The true one. The true tabernacle of which this is a copy is consecrated by the blood of Jesus himself. Hebrews 9 points out, tells us instructs us. And so we ought to be confident by faith, that takes God at His word that what we participate in on earth is actually a participation in.

What we are doing on. Earth is actually a participation in these awesome realities in heaven. They did that. Which at their at the time looked forward in the future to what would take place when Christ comes. And there was a lot of earthly glory and earthly design. We now do that which doesn't look forward in the future but rejoices exults in the present of what we are participating in as Christ who has come Christ, who has finished his work Christ, who has consecrated this Christ who leads our worship from glory presides over the worship of His people.

So the Lord has prescribed for us that worship. Which Christ leads from heaven and He teaches us to look to him for all provision willingness of heart and whatever is necessary earthly, speaking in order to follow His commands. But especially that he would provide himself, keep providing himself in his worship and in Jesus himself.

And he gives us this confidence as we take him at his word by faith. That indeed we on earth are participating and that glorious reality in heaven. Amen. Let's pray Our Father in heaven. When we come to an article like this and and dullness and darkness of mind and coldness of heart, we can hardly begin to anticipate what glories there are here.

What? Treasures of truth because you have given yourself in reality as our great treasure in Christ. So we thank You and praise you for what you did for your people at that time, that they might be able to look forward prospectively. And hoping in Christ draw near to these preliminary displays if your glory and we thank you O Lord that you have given us that fullness that truth that reality in heaven in glory now where we are seated with Jesus in the heavenly places to which that was even just a copy and a shadow.

Oh Lord. Help our hearts. Help us to have the faith that can grasp these things. Help us to have not just willing and cheerful hearts to give and to participate. But to receive, and to rejoice over what you have given us in the New Testament, worship of your people in heaven and on earth together and make us O God.

To adhere only to that which you have prescribed and never to to add or embellish that which is from us. Lest we miss your indescribable gift and profane that which you have made. So on improvably, glorious in Christ, Grant it, we ask for the sake of His glory and for the sake of our perception of enjoyment of displaying of his glory, we ask and His name, Amen.
