INTRODUCTION: TWO WAYS OF THINKING

God made two types of brains for humans. He made the engineer brain, and He made the philosopher brain.

Engineer: logical, concrete, dutiful, steady, faithful, task-oriented

Philosopher: abstract, visionary, flexible, creative, people-oriented

One of the dangers the engineer faces is that he might be perfectly content to follow Jesus out of a sense of duty.

The relationship between man and God goes far deeper than mere duty. At its core is love. As we work through our series on prayer, , I want to show you that the underlying attitude of prayer is love between us and God.

John 16:26, 27

In that day you will ask in My name, and I do not say to you that I will request of the Father on your behalf; for the Father Himself loves you, because you have loved Me and have believed that I came forth from the Father.

Proposition: God generously loves us (as evidenced by prayer) so we should generously love others.

Instruct [those who are rich in this world] to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share...

? Who is poor? Anyone who has less than you.
