- A. Because the only reason we can believe in Jesus is if God first gives us a new heart so that we can believe. (Review Scriptures under II. B.)
- **Q.** Do we deserve this new heart that God gives us?
- A. No! Our new heart that makes us want to believe in Jesus is a gracious gift from God.
- Q. Do you believe in Jesus? Are you trusting in Him to save you from your sins and God's wrath? If so, then who deserves **all** the credit and all the glory?

- Q. Since we know that God is still going to give new hearts to many other people in the world, what should we be joyfully doing?
