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PECA Sermon Outline on 1 Cor. 11:28, WLC Q&A 171, Jan. 18, 2015

### Intro:

Vss. 17-22: correcting abuse of Lord's Supper. Why matters: vss. 27, 29-30

Main Point of Text: Paul is concerned that our bad Table manners at the Lord's Supper will cause us to be cursed; so that we instead receive Christ's intended blessing with proper behavior, Paul commands our holy preparation.

READ WLC Q&A 171 Other motivation: vs. 31 (vs. 28, prove/approve).

<u>Sermon Point:</u> Prove to Yourself that You Should and Would Partake.

## Move 1: Prove to yourself that you are in Christ and love His Heavenly Father.

LC: Examine "of their being in Christ": 2 Cor. 13:5: Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you ...

LC: Examine "of their desires after Christ" **John 7:37:** ... *If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink*. (John 7:37) Test your thirst: Ps. 42:1-2. LC: Examine "love to God": Mt. 22:36-37 of Deut. 6:5. John 14:15. Seen in 1 John 4:20-21.

### Move 2: Prove to yourself that you love your brethren.

LC: "love to ... the brethren, charity to all men". Mt. 22:39 of Lev. 19:18:

- 1 Cor. 10:16, 17: For we being many are one bread, and one body: for we are all partakers of that one bread.
- Acts 2:46-47: And they, continuing daily with <u>one accord</u> in the temple, and <u>breaking bread from</u> house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and <u>singleness of heart</u>, Praising God, and <u>having favour with all the people</u>. And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved.

LC: Examine of "forgiving those that have done them wrong"; Mt. 5:23-24. Jn. 3:16. Lord's Prayer.

## Move 3: Prove to yourself that you hate your sins and want more holiness.

LC: Examine "of their sins and wants": <u>Purge out therefore the old leaven</u> ... For even Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us: Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, neither with <u>the leaven of malice</u> and wickedness; ... (1 Cor. 5:7-8 of Ex. 12).

LC: Examine "of their desires after ... their new obedience.

LC: Examine "of the truth and measure of their knowledge, faith, repentance": Look for fruit, taste ripeness. LC: "by renewing the exercise of these graces": **2 Tim. 1:6:** ... stir up [kindle into a flame] the gift of God, which is in thee ... Beg a blessing of the Lord's Supper. Make the most of mercy: Heb. 10:21-25. Ps. 26:6.

# Move 4: Prove all these things to yourself by examining yourself.

LC: "by serious meditation, and fervent prayer":

- 2 Cor. 13:5: <u>Examine</u> [Greek, Test, make a trial of] <u>yourselves</u>, whether ye be in the faith; <u>prove</u> your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you ... Self examination
- 2 Pet. 1:10: Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:
- <u>1 Cor. 11:28:</u>
  - o "himself": retire from busyness/chaos of world. Get alone/get quiet w/ self. Turn off to tune in.
  - o Examine: Greek, "Prove" (same as 'prove your own selves' above). Test reality, and improve.
  - o Examine/Eat/Drink all imperatives.
  - o "Examine" literally, "prove"; but also "approve" ... "that he *may*".
