 - a. The *already* and *not yet*
- B. Unity of the faith and knowledge of the Son of God
 - 1. Faith and knowledge in the already and not yet
- C. To a mature man
 - 1. the heart-break of babies who never mature
 - 2. the frustration of pastors who do not equip their flock
- D. To the measure and stature of the fullness of Christ
