Your Best Life Later: Prioritizing Our Life by Redemption and Resurrection Genesis 22:20-23:20

Main idea: Believers are to handle money, and the other things of this life, with priorities that are shaped by God's plan of redemption and by the certainty of our resurrection.

Introduction: Let's make a deal! The shockingly bad bargaining of Abraham. Why was he willing to spend so much?

- 1. Prioritizing by redemption: What's going on in the rest of the world? Another mother for Jesus.
 - a. There is a priority given to Rebekah, and also to Sarah, that sticks out like a sore thumb. Why? Because in God's view of history, He prioritizes the bringing of the redeemer and the application of His redemption.
 - b. Prioritize things like marriage and parenting, which Christ has given a significant role in this work that He is doing.
 - c. Prioritize your own being conformed to Christ.
 - d. Prioritize your assigned part in Christ's redeeming and conforming others to Himself.
- 2. Prioritizing by resurrection: 400 pieces of silver for unwanted real estate.
 - a. Why was Abraham willing to pay so much? Because his religion was a religion of resurrection.
 - i. He trusted in a Savior who would solve the death problem
 - ii. Belief in the resurrection is what enabled him to believe the promise despite the deadness of Sarah's womb (Rom 4).
 - iii. Belief in the resurrection is what enabled him to obey regarding the sacrifice of Isaac.

b. Applications

- i. View earthly possessions as existing for the service of the kingdom.
- ii. Treat your body as something that belongs to Christ—both before and after death.
- iii. Live always in this world as one who belongs to heaven above, and who will receive soon not only a New Heaven but also a New Earth
- 3. Prioritizing by Christ
 - a. Redemption is a priority because it is the way that God has determined to glorify His Son
 - b. Resurrection is a priority because it is necessary to this glory of Jesus in redemption that He be served by those who have been perfected, in both soul and body, forever and ever.
