Introduction: <u>Glory</u> and <u>love</u> are the two great themes of <u>John</u>, <u>the Bible</u>, <u>Hopewell church</u>, and indeed <u>everything</u>! So, they are our two great themes, as we begin to study Christ's plan for Hopewell and its pastors.

- 1.We have been gloriously loved
 - a.Jesus describes the events now set into motion as the Son of Man <u>being</u> <u>glorified</u> and God <u>being glorified</u> in Him
 - b.Here, Jesus' love is especially glorified (cf. 13:1)
 - c. Here, God's love is especially glorified in Him (cf. 1:14, 18)
 - d.God's <u>atoning sacrifice</u> in Jesus Christ is how we know <u>love</u> (cf. 1John 4:7-12)
 - e.God is saying to us: "I love you, at least <u>as much as my Son</u>." Here, we must know that, from all eternity, God has <u>loved us IN Christ</u> (cf. Eph 1:3-6)
 - f. Jesus is saying to us: "I love you with My love for My Father"
- 2.We are gloriously **loving**
 - a.We love God and keep His commandments, because He first loved us (cf. 1Jo 4:19); first great commandment
 - b.We love **one another** because **we love God** (cf. 1Jo 4:20-5:1); second great commandment
 - c. Right now, we cannot <u>serve Christ's earthly needs</u>, but we can <u>serve</u> <u>His body's earthly needs</u> (cf. Mat 25:31-46)
 - d.We show that we are <u>disciples</u> of Christ in many ways, but especially when we <u>love one another</u>.
 - e.We don't always get to love Christ in the way that we want to
 - f. One day, we may get to love Christ by dying for Him
 - g.Every day, we get to <u>love</u> Christ by <u>living for one another</u>

Conclusion: Even though we <u>love</u> one another <u>imperfectly</u>, we still <u>love</u> one another gloriously, because our <u>loving one another</u> is a display of <u>Christ's</u> <u>love in us</u>
