Today, we will examine what true worship looks like in the worst of times.

God's Word reminds us that our worship of Him, both personally and corporately, should share with the young prophet Isaiah these five elements set forth in Isaiah 6 (ESV):

- Recognition: "I saw the Lord . . . " (v. 1)
- Praise: "Holy, holy, holy . . . " (v. 3)
- Confession: "Woe is me!" (v. 5)
- Assurance of Pardon: "Your guilt is taken away . . ." (v. 7)
- Commitment: "Here am I!" (v. 8)
