- trusts in Christ alone for salvation. (John 3:16; Acts 10:43; Acts 16:31)
- comes to Christ. (John 6:37; Mt. 11:28)
- 3. <u>believes</u> in the message of <u>Christ's</u> <u>cross</u>. (1 Cor. 1:18; Romans 1:16)
- has responded to the Gospel. (1 Cor. 15:1-4)
- 5. has been <u>placed in Christ</u> at salvation. (John 15:2; 2 Cor. 5:17)
- receives the <u>free gift</u> of salvation which was paid for by Christ's finished work. (Rom. 3:24, 6:23; Eph. 2:8-9)
- 7. has eternal life. (Jn. 6:47, 11:25-26)
- 8. trusts Christ alone at a <u>point in time</u>. (Acts 16:31; John 4:14)

- 7. enjoys an <u>abundant life now</u> and afterward <u>inherits qualitative eternal life</u>. (Mk. 10:28-30; Mt.19:27-29)
