Conclusions:

(Gal 3:10) When a person chooses to rely/depend on the Mosaic Law, they are currently under a curse because the Law itself states, you are cursed if you do not keep all of the Law all the time.

(Gal. 3:11-12) – According to the LORD: The Just shall live by faith and by contrast your righteousness by the means of the Law is based on a lifetime of works

(Gal. 3:13) Christ's ransomed the believer from the curse of the Law by becoming a curse (according to the Law) in our place and then paid the penalty the Law demanded

(Gal. 3:14) The redemption of believers from under the curse of the Law means justification and the receiving of the Holy Spirit through faith in Jesus Christ is available to all people.
