The Danger of False Professions of Faith Matthew 7:21-23

Verses 21-22

Note: I am indebted to John Stott, The Message of the Sermon on the Mount, p. 206f, for a few of the following suggestions.

First, these false professions of faith are *persistent*, as seen both in this life (vs. 21, "who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,'") and their insistence on the day of judgment (vs. 22, "in that day").

John 3:1-8

Second, these false professions of faith are passionate (vss. 21-22, "Lord, Lord" repeated twice).

Third, these false professions of faith are public (vs. 22, "prophesied in Your name").

Fourth, these false professions of faith are accompanied by the performance of wonders (vs. 22, "cast out demons" and "done many wonders").

The Example of Judas Iscariot: Mark 3:14-19; 6:7, 12-13; John 6:66-71; 17:11-12

Jesus and the Apostles Foretold False Prophets: Matthew 24:24; 2 Thessalonians 2:8-10

Fifth, these false professions of faith are accompanied by claims to have operated in the *power* of Jesus' name (vs. 22, "in Your name" is repeated three times).

Verse 23

Jesus never knew them in a saving way, as their Lord and Savior.

1 Corinthians 8:3

John Newton, writer of the hymn, "Amazing Grace," once wrote: "If I ever reach heaven I expect to find three wonders there: first, to meet some I had not thought to see there; second, to miss some I had expected to see there; and third, the greatest wonder of all, to find myself there."
