### **Sermon Outline**

#### Consider Yourself Alive to God Romans 6:11

- I. Introduction: Our new identity in Christ
  - The significance of Christ's resurrection
  - Review: Consider yourselves dead to sin (Rom 6:11a)
- II. Exposition: Our new identity Alive to God
  - A. You are a new creation
    - 1. No longer a slave to sin (Rom 6:6-7,14)
    - 2. Indwelt and empowered by the Holy Spirit (Rom 8:11)
    - 3. A servant of righteousness (Rom 6:10,18,22)
  - B. You now have eternal life
    - 1. No need to fear death
      - Physical death will usher us into the presence of Christ (2 Cor 5:8)
      - The second death has no claims on you (Rom 6:9; John 11:25, 5:24)
    - 2. Jesus is coming back to raise us up to be with Him (John 14:2; Rom 6:5,8)
