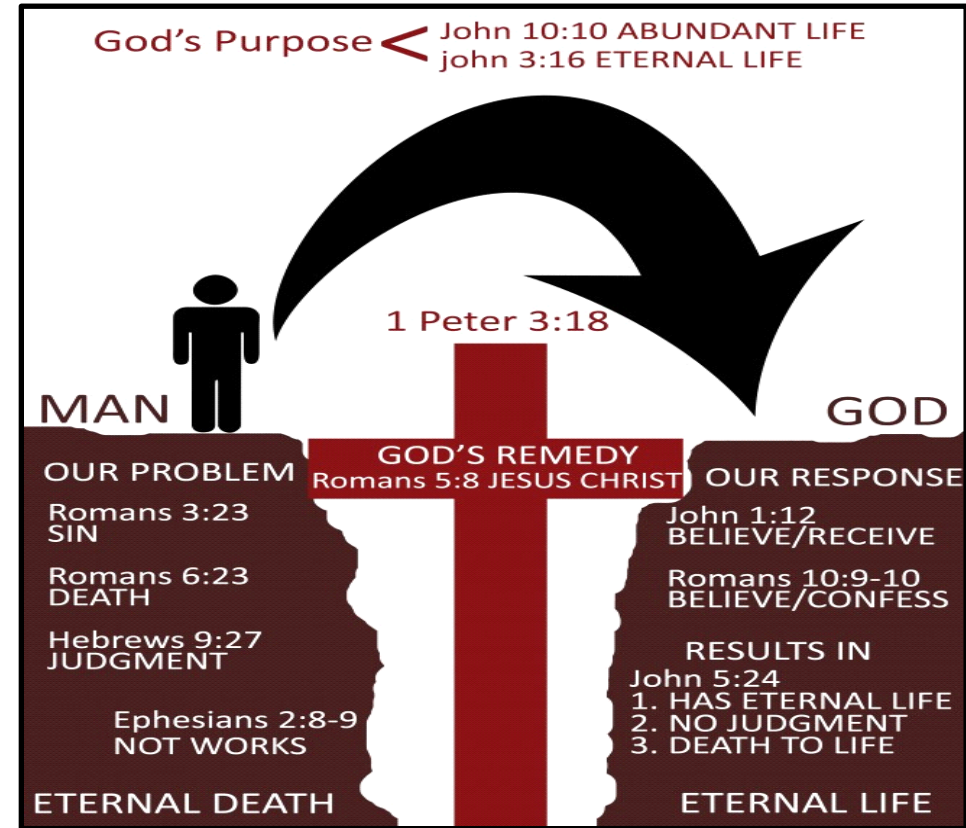

The Final Act: Saul's Judgment 1 Samuel 28 & 31

God providentially arranged the circumstances so that king Saul would die in judgment.

The Philistines prepared a plan to defeat and conquer Israel - **1 Samuel 28:1–2; 29:1–2**

- David was not going to fight with the Philistines against Israel.
- The Lord providentially forbade David from implementing his plan to turn against the Philistines and fight for Israel and king Saul (29:3–11).

28:3 - God would speak through His Prophet not through witchcraft - **Deuteronomy 18:9–22**

28:4–6 - Saul's sinfulness left him afraid because the Lord had forsaken him - **Isaiah 48:22** "There is no peace," says the LORD, "for the wicked."

28:7–10 - Saul was willing to go to an extreme in his sin against the Lord.

- He travelled through the Philistine battle lines.
- He disguised himself.
- He took the Lord's name in vain.
- Granting royal immunity to a witch was blasphemous - **Romans 1:32** who, knowing the righteous judgment of God, that those who practice such things are deserving of death, not only do the same but also approve of those who practice them.

28:11–19 - Samuel made a visit from the dead to pronounce judgment upon Saul.

- It seems God made an exception in allowing Samuel to speak from the dead.
- In conjuring up Samuel from the dead, Saul committed a capital crime - **Leviticus 20:6** And the person who turns to mediums and familiar spirits, to prostitute himself with them, I will set My face against that person and cut him off from his people; **1 Chronicles 10:13–14**
- Samuel repeated the Lord's name as he reminded Saul of his sin and pronounced to him his judgment.

28:20–25 - Saul was afraid to die because he knew he was facing eternal judgment.

- The only fellowship Saul had was with a witch under the curse of God.
- Saul was practicing religion, but he had no fellowship with God or God's people.

31:1–6 - Saul died in judgment - **Psalms 7**

- Saul died at the hand of the enemy, committed suicide, and was beheaded.
- Saul was not a righteous man; he was not a man of faith or repentance.
- Saul was a wicked man; he did not trust the Lord and neither did he repent.

While the Lord was removing Saul from the throne, He was promoting David to the throne.
