Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.

Introduction:

"What is required to restore true biblical authority in the Church?"

I. Biblical authority requires receptivity to all biblically based assertions.

A. Apostolicity establishes biblical authority.

B. Receptivity means teachability.

II. Biblical authority requires evaluation by one ultimate standard.

A. Almighty God is the ultimate authority in His world.

B. God's Word is the principal channel of His authority.

III. Biblical authority requires evaluation of all other authorities.

A. Evaluation by individual Christians.

B. Evaluation including church authorities.
