

The Lord Set Up the Throne of David 2 Samuel 2:8–4:12

- v. 2:8–11 It took time before God established the throne of David.
 - David did not to wage an all-out war to conquer Israel.
 - There was no king over Israel for the first five years David was king in Hebron.
- v. 2:12–32 It cost lives before God established the throne of David.
 - Abner's military power grew strong enough to confront David's military.
 - Abner initiated a unique challenge to avoid a total war between armies.
 - Joab, Abishai, and Asahel were David's nephews (1Ch 2:16).
 - Asahel refused to backdown. The problem was he was going it alone, he got out of his
 element, and he was in way over his head.
 - Asahel was impetuous. He misjudged and it cost him his life.
 - Abner called for a cease fire.
- v. 3:1–5 God blessed David Psalm 27:13–14 I would have lost heart, unless I had believed That I would see the goodness of the LORD In the land of the living. Wait on the LORD; Be of good courage, And He shall strengthen your heart; Wait, I say, on the LORD!
- v. 3:6–39 God arranged the circumstances so that Israel willingly set up the throne of David.
 - It is possible that Ishbosheth falsely accused Abner because Abner was no traitor.
 - Abner realized that he was fighting a lost cause and converted to David.
 - Abner initiated a plan to set up the throne of David.
 - David did not consider himself as divorced from Michal. He was related to Saul.
 - David showed mercy to Abner and was willing to receive him.
 - Joab killed Abner to avenge the death of Asahel Numbers 35:19–21
 - David mourned for Abner and cleared any blame to himself.
 - David rejected Joab's severe and rigid way of dealing with Abner.
 - David wanted to avoid a bloody purge of those who were formerly on Saul's side.
 - David left the judgment of Joab to the Lord.
- v. 4:1–12 The Lord finally and permanently ended the throne of Saul.
 - David intended to keep his promise to King Saul (1Sa 24:21–22).
 - David did not need nor did he want the help of wicked men.
 - David executed these men as murderers Numbers 35:31 Moreover you shall take no ransom for the life of a murderer who is guilty of death, but he shall surely be put to death.
- v. 5:1–5 The throne of David was set up by the power and wisdom of God which overcomes the weakness and foolishness of man 1 Corinthians 1:25–31 Because the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.
- (29) ...that no flesh should glory in His presence. (31) ...that, as it is written, "HE WHO GLORIES, LET HIM GLORY IN THE LORD."
