"Early Morning Prayer" Psalm 5

To the Chief Musician. With Flutes. A Psalm of David.

Give ear to my words, O LORD, Consider my meditation. ²Give heed to the voice of my cry, My King and my God, For to You I will pray. My voice You shall hear in the morning, O LORD; In the morning I will direct *it* to You, And I will look up. ⁴ For You *are* not a God who takes pleasure in wickedness. Nor shall evil dwell with You. ⁵ The boastful shall not stand in Your sight; You hate all workers of iniquity. You shall destroy those who speak falsehood; The LORD abhors the bloodthirsty and deceitful man.⁷ But as for me, I will come into Your house in the multitude of Your mercy; In fear of You I will worship toward Your holy temple.⁸ Lead me, O LORD, in Your righteousness because of my enemies; Make Your way straight before my face.⁹ For there is no faithfulness in their mouth; Their inward part is destruction: Their throat is an open tomb: They flatter with their tongue. ¹⁰ Pronounce them guilty, O God! Let them fall by their own counsels; Cast them out in the multitude of their transgressions, For they have rebelled against You. ¹¹ But let all those rejoice who put their trust in You; Let them ever shout for joy, because You defend them; Let those also who love Your name Be joyful in You. ¹² For You, O LORD, will bless the righteous; With favor You will surround him as with a shield. Psalm 5 (NKJV)

One of the first important things I realized Pastor Bruce and I had in common was a desire to PRAY! Before hurricane Ian happened to us: Pastor Bruce, myself, Paster Archie and Pastor Joe were meeting EARLY in the morning one day a week for prayer!

I believe, whether we meet with anyone else while we do it or not, the BEST way to start any day is by acknowledging God by reading His Word (The Bible) & Praying!

I. Make first things first, communicate with God, EARLY –

To the Chief Musician. With Flutes. A Psalm of David.

- 1. David was God's King. A man after God's own heart. His Psalms were songs, most of them written for worship!
- 2. This Psalm is about EARLY morning prayer:

¹ Give ear to my words, O LORD, Consider my meditation. ²Give heed to the voice of my cry, My King and my God, For to You I will pray. ³ My voice You shall hear in the morning, O LORD; In the morning I will direct *it* to You, And I will look up. Psalm 5:1-3

- A. In this prayer there is a pleading for God's hearing :1 A Give ear to my words, O LORD
- B. He asks God to consider his "meditation" **:1 B** His thinking about God and the things of God!
- C. He asks God to hear the voice of his cry this tells us David was passionate, emotional, real and NEEDY in His prayer! **:2** A
- D. David was a king himself, but God he knew was the REAL KING :2 B
- *E.* **:3 My voice shall though hear in the morning ...** *This is David's commitment, his vow, his promise to God, expressed twice for emphasis!*

II. The reason(s) for coming to God, EARLY, we don't have much going for us without Him, meaning without God –

⁴ For You *are* not a God who takes pleasure in wickedness, Nor shall evil dwell with You. ⁵ The boastful shall not stand in Your sight; You hate all workers of iniquity. ⁶ You shall destroy those who speak falsehood; The LORD abhors the bloodthirsty and deceitful man. Psalm 5:4-6 1. Scripture tells us everyone, except Jesus Christ is a sinner –

¹⁰ As it is written: "There is none righteous, no, not one; ¹¹ There is none who understands; There is none who seeks after God. ¹² They have all turned aside; They have together become unprofitable; There is none who does good, no, not one." Romans 3:10–12 (NKJV)

- 2. **Psalm 5 Verses 4-6** tells us God's attitude toward wickedness, evil, boastful people, workers of iniquity, those who lie or murder, basically He abhors them and will destroy them.
- 3. However, the "For" at the beginning of verse **:4** makes these things THE REASON for David's early fervent PRAYER mentioned in **Psalm 5:1-3**
- A. When something is WRONG dealing with it EARLY!

B. When you NEED help or mercy from God, GO to Him EARLY! ² For He says: "In an acceptable time I have heard you, And in the day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation. 2 Corinthians 6:2

C. Pray early, often, always because we can do nothing without Jesus Christ, NOTHING without God -

⁵ "I am the vine, you *are* the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. John 15:5 (NKJV)

III. What we should expect coming to God EARLY:

- 1. Mercy from God -
- ⁷ But as for me, I will come into Your house in the multitude of Your mercy; Psalm 5:7 A
- 2. Our own reverence, fear of God –

In fear of You I will worship toward Your holy temple. Psalm 5:7 B

3. God's guidance –

⁸ Lead me, O LORD, in Your righteousness because of my enemies; Make Your way straight before my face. Psalm 5:8

- *IV.* What we should expect from an ungodly world –
- 1. Lies ⁹ For there is no faithfulness in their mouth; Psalm 5:9 A
- 2. Corrupt hearts Their inward part is destruction; Psalm 5:9 B
- 4. Bad breath Their throat is an open tomb; Psalm 5:9 C
- 5. A flattering tongue **They flatter with their tongue. Psalm 5:9 D** *These are salesmen, and what they sell is Hell!*
 - ¹ Blessed *is* the man Who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, Nor stands in the path of sinners, Nor sits in the seat of the scornful; Psalm 1:1 (NKJV)

V. Imprecatory prayer, against the wicked – ¹⁰ Pronounce them guilty, O God! Let them fall by their own counsels; Cast them out in the multitude of their transgressions, For they have rebelled against You. Psalm 5:10

Psalm 5:10 and other verses like it are hard for us to understand because they seem to go against what Jesus teaches about LOVING and praying for our enemies -

⁴³ "You have heard that it was said, '*You shall love your neighbor* and hate your enemy.' ⁴⁴ But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you, ⁴⁵ that you may be sons of your Father in heaven; for He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. ⁴⁶ For if you love those who love you, what reward have you? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? ⁴⁷ And if you greet your brethren only, what do you do more *than others?* Do not even the tax collectors do so? ⁴⁸ Therefore you shall be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect. Matthew 5:43–48 (NKJV)

- Yet, Jesus is dealing with us on a PERSONAL LEVEL While David is praying as a KING, one in Government, who was charged by God with dealing with crime and evil!
- Basically, in his imprecatory prayer David is asking for God's HELP dealing with evil under his government!
- Similarly, on Memorial Day, we remember men who not only died fighting for justice, but also killed.
- *If it is right to fight against EVIL, it is also right to PRAY against it. Not for selfish welfare but for public or national welfare.*

VI. David's prayer for God's people –

¹¹ But let all those rejoice who put their trust in You; Let them ever shout for joy, because You defend them; Let those also who love Your name Be joyful in You. ¹² For You, O LORD, will bless the righteous; With favor You will surround him as *with* a shield.
