Q95. What is the seventh commandment? The seventh commandment is, Thou shalt not commit adultery.

Man, who is the only creature made in His image? But then when it comes to our various interactions with other people, not only are we to not murder them. Not only are we to love our neighbor as ourselves. But marriage is super important. Because God gave marriage. For the help.

Of one another to glorify God and enjoy him properly. And God gave marriage especially as a picture. Of the relationship between Jesus. And his church. And that is the reason for all of creation and all of Providence. So, that by Redemption. The Lord Jesus, the son. Might take to himself and perfect for himself a bride.

And the glory of God in God, the son. So the glory of the Triune God. In the glory of the son forever and ever. Is, especially in the glory of the Whom he saves and whom he sanctifies whom he perfects and makes to be glorious with his own glory and beautiful.

With his own. And so marriage is super important for the purpose of all things. Marriage is super important for Uh man glorifying God because of the help that we get in marriage marriage is super important. For the production of Godly seed, it is God's ordained way for multiplying image, bearers.

And so when he makes the seventh commandment the seventh and uh and gives us the Commandment about Purity in marriage. He is showing us How important marriage is? And the decree of God, in his design, For creation. And for Providence, And for Redemption.
