- 1. Read **1 Peter 5:8-9** and **Ephesians 6:10-12**. What are some of the ways you see this kind of opposition played out in your life? How does it help to consider that the enemy is behind so many of the things that seek to derail your loyalty and obedience to Christ?
- 2. Read Acts 23:11 and Acts 27:24. When you look back at your life and how God's plan has unfolded for you, at what junctures did your next steps require courage, faith, and fearlessness? How did you do in displaying those?
- 3. Read **Jeremiah 42:7-12**. Just as the Church has been promised that it will accomplish all its divinely ordained goals in this age, Israel was promised the same during the exile in Babylon. How can Jeremiah's words to Israel strengthen you to be optimistic and bold in living out your role as a part of the New Testament Church?
- 4. Read **Proverbs 4:1-13**. How might the wisdom described in this passage help you make good decisions, and aid you in navigating the particular challenges and trials you presently face?
- 5. Read **James 3:13-18**. How does godly wisdom differ from the kinds of strategic thinking and intelligent defenses the world may cling to during times of trouble and difficulty?
