Immanuel Reformed Fellowship marks the return of the Reformed Church in the United States in south central Iowa after over an eighty-year absence. In the early 1900's, the RCUS was known as the "German Reformed Church."

The denomination's heritage goes back to the sixteenth-century Protestant Reformation when God raised church reformers to direct His people back to the teachings of sacred Scripture. By the 1700's, the German Reformed Church made its presence in the United States and would prosper and eventually merge to form a new denomination with the remnant desiring to remain as the Reformed Church in the United States.

The RCUS holds that God's Word is authoritative, sufficient, necessary, and perspicuous for all of life, and that the Bible is the inspired, infallible, and inerrant Word of God.

The RCUS adopted the Three Forms of Unity (the Heidelberg Catechism, the Belgic Confession, and the Canons of Dort) as its confessional subordinate standards that systematically and rightly reflect the teachings of sacred Scripture.

The church polity of the RCUS is consistorial-presbyterial.



Beloved in the Lord, hear the words of the apostle Paul concerning the institution of the holy supper of our Lord Jesus Christ: For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: the Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, **"This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me."** In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, **"This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."** For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Beloved, hear these gracious words of promise spoken by our Lord: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matt. 11:28-29). "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty. . . . Whoever comes to me I will never drive away" (John 6:35, 37b). "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled" (Matt. 5:6). The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." (1 Cor. 11:23b- 24) All those, however, who do not repent, who do not put their trust in the Lord Jesus, and who have no desire to lead a godly life, are warned, according to the command of God, to keep themselves from the holy sacrament.

If we are living in disobedience to Christ and in enmity with our neighbors, we must repent of our sin and reconcile ourselves to our neighbors before we come to the Lord's table. For if we partake of the sacrament in unbelief and willful disobedience, we eat and drink judgment to ourselves. This solemn warning is not designed, however, to discourage penitent sinners from coming to the holy sacrament. We do not come to the supper as though we were righteous in ourselves but rather to testify that we are sinners and that we look to Jesus Christ for our salvation.

Although we do not have perfect faith and do not serve and love God with all our hearts, and though we do not love our neighbors as we ought, we are confident that the Savior accepts us at his table when we come in humble faith, with sorrow for our sins, and with a will to follow him as he commands. All, then, who are truly sorry for their sins, who sincerely believe in the Lord Jesus as their Savior, and who earnestly desire to lead a godly life, ought to accept the invitation now given and come with gladness to the table of their Lord. ¹⁵ "You shall not steal.

¹⁶ "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

¹⁷ "You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's."

God Calls Us to Confess Our Need Heidelberg Catechism LD 25 Q&A 65-68

65. Since, then, we are made partakers of Christ and all His benefits by faith only, where does this faith come from?

The Holy Spirit works faith in our hearts by the preaching of the Holy Gospel, and confirms it by the use of the holy sacraments.

66. What are the sacraments?

The sacraments are visible holy signs and seals appointed by God for this end, that by their use He may the more fully declare and seal to us

We come before His table in celebration of our Lord's body and blood

Beloved in Jesus Christ, since it is our privilege at this time to celebrate the blessed sacrament of the Lord's Supper, we are called to prepare our hearts by rightly examining ourselves. For the apostle Paul has written: "Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup" (1 Cor. 11:27-28).

Let all of us, then, **examine our lives** and, considering our own sin and the wrath of God on it, be sure that we humble ourselves in repentance before God. Let us **examine our hearts** to be sure that we trust in Jesus Christ alone for our salvation, and that we believe our sins are forgiven wholly by grace, for the sake of our Lord's sacrifice on the cross. Finally, let us **examine our motivation, standard, and purpose** to be sure that we resolve to live in faith and obedience before our Lord, and in love and peace with our neighbors.
