- _____ which is sometimes associated with brimstone (Gen. 19.24 , Deut. 29.22) changes _____ as its heat intensifies. Flames when at their coolest appear with a _____ hue (1,000 to 1,500 F). As they increase in heat they become _____ (1,500 to 2,200 F). A further increase of heat turns the flame _____ (2,200 to 2,400 F) . In its hottest state a _____/violet hue appears (2,500 to 2900 F). It would seem that the heat of the fire progresses with the color spectrum (ROYGBIV).

- Jacinth is a variation of the hyacinth _____ which should not be confused with the Hyacinth flower (which is deep blue). Hyacinth is from the _____ mineral family and has a brown, gray or sometimes red color. When it is found in its _____ variety (yellow, orange, red), it is of the hyacinth variety.

- _____ is mentioned often in Scriptures. It rained down on _____ and _____ (Gen. 19.24, Luke 17.29). It will be present in the _____ of _____ as well (Rev. 20.10,21.8). * _____ of Horses as Heads of Lions— The locust had teeth of lions (9.8). Greater _____ could not be described. Their heads are large in size with full mane in view.

* The _____ Issued Fire and Smoke and Brimstone— These three are descriptive of the _____ of hell (Rev. 14.20, 19.20, 20.10, 21.8) and bring great terror/torment to those that behold them. Humanity often depicts the horror and fear of a fire breathing beast, but at this judgment, his _____ will be realized. These three are stated to be their chiefest power (exousia 69x "_____" and 29x "_____"). Authority is given to them to exercise the power to kill _____ of the rebellious worshippers of the Beast.

* Their _____ were like unto Serpents— The tails resemble that of the great _____ (Rev. 12.9,14,15, 20.2). Their tails seemingly have heads at their end (instead of a rattle). Perhaps these scaly tails with a head have also _____ to inject poison into their victims. Nevertheless, these heads bring great _____ much like the demon-locust (9.10). From their front and back, they bring _____.

If it were not for the horror that is presented, these horsemen certainly would be a sight to behold. This is a powerful demonic horde, but God has His own (and greater) divine _____ (Psa. 68.17—20K, even thousands of angels, Matt. 26.53—12 Legions). They are a dynamic _____ (Isa. 37.36—1= 185K).
