#### The Covenant Itself

- ◆ Gen. 6:18-22
- + Gen. 8:20-22
- ◆ Gen. 9:1-7
- + Gen. 9:8-17

### **Promised blessings**

- God will never again curse the ground or kill all living creatures.
- Seedtime and harvest, day and night will continue as long as the earth exists.
- ◆ Man may now eat meat.

# Faithful response

- Trust and built the ark.
- Subdue and fill the earth (the creation mandate still applies; we are to work in the world instead of just waiting to escape).
- Recognize the sanctity of life.

## Jesus' fulfillment

◆ Ephesians 5:2 — Jesus' sacrifice is the fragrant offering that turns aside God's wrath (Gen. 8:21).

- ◆ 2 Peter 3:4-13 Jesus' second coming is delayed even after His work on the cross because of God's patience and concern for the whole world.
- ◆ Matthew 28:19 Now that Jesus has come, the gospel can go out to every nation.

### **Continuing promises**

- ◆ We don't have to live in terror of catastrophic changes in the natural order (2012, climate change, killer bees etc.)
- ★ We have been graciously granted time to share the gospel; how are we using that time?

### **Old Testament Readings**

- ◆ Terms and ideas to look for: God's rule over nature, Baal-worship, disregard for life, capital punishment, rainbow.
- → Hosea 2:14-23 God's covenant with all of creation is set as the backdrop to His patient redemption of His people.
- Psalm 19:1-6 The orderliness of the elements bears witness to the whole world.
- Ezekiel 8:15-16 Israel was constantly tempted to offer worship for the sake of sustaining fertility/harvest even though God had already promised that He would sustain seedtime and harvest.
