Holiness is the core character of God... and as such it is the thing we need and do not possess, but in God's grace and mercy, it is the thing He provides first for us in the person of Christ.

For the law appoints as high priests men who have weakness, but the word of the oath, which came after the law, appoints the Son who has been perfected forever." (Hebrews 7:27–28, NKJV)

B. Being a worthy Sacrifice
