MIGHTY TO SAVE | MARK 5:1-20

Context: Jesus and the disciples have just crossed the Sea of Galilee where Jesus calmed the sea (Mark 4). When they arrive on the other shore, in the region of the Gerasenes, they are greeted by a demon possessed man.

Since God is mighty to save, we must tell others
