Question:

Answer:

Baptism and the Lord's Supper become spiritually helpful, not from any virtue in them, or in him who does administer them (1Cor. 3:7; 1 Peter 3:21), but only by the blessing of Christ (1Cor. 3:6), and the working of the Spirit in those who by faith receive them (1Cor. 12:13).

Sermon: Ezekiel Part 2: God in Residence
