

The Gift to the Blessed

This 17th stanza of the 119th Psalm is headed by the Hebrew letter *Pe*. This letter, like others, can have multiple pronounciational sounds depending on the *dagesh* (diacritical _____). If located in the center of this Hebrew letter, the result is a hard “p” sound like “Peter.” When the *dagesh* is not present, this letter has a “ph” or “f” sound like “fail.”

When used as a noun, *pe* is the word for “_____.” This is much like the other Hebrew letters: *ayin* (_____—v.135) and *jod* (hand).

In this passage, the Word of God is proclaimed as “_____.” Biblically, to be wonderful is to be extraordinary and surpassing even the greatest events of life. “_____” refers to miraculous occurrences.
