
1 Corinthians 1:1-9 (ESV)

- 1 Paul, called by the will of God to be an apostle of Christ Jesus, and our brother Sosthenes,
- **2** To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together with all those who in every place call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours:
- **3** Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

1st Corinthians — Introduction

- 4 I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus,
- 5 that in every way you were enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge—
- **6** even as the testimony about Christ was confirmed among you—
- 7 so that you are not lacking in any gift, as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ,
- **8** who will sustain you to the end, guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- **9** God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

- Corinth II
 - ✓ Sacked and destroyed in 146 B.C.
 - ✓ Rebuilt in 44 B.C. by Julius Caesar
- Although Greek, it was a Roman city
- Energetic business culture quick success or quick failure a part of the mindset

- Greetings vv1-3
 - Call of the Apostle v1
 - Call of the saints v2
 - Common faith with the wider Church v3
- Thanksgiving vv4-9
 - Grace of God given to them vv4-8
 - Enriched in speech and knowledge v5
 - Confirmed in their testimony v6
 - Not lacking in gifts v7
 - Sustained until the end v8
 - Faithfulness of God v9

- Because of his commission by Christ v17

17 "For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel, and not with words of eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power."


The Focus of Paul's Letter

1 Corinthians 1:20-21 (ESV) — 20 Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? 21 For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe....

1 Corinthians 1:23 (ESV) — 23 but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles,
