Sin and Consequences

The Sin

- Satan rebelled against God. (Revelation 12:3-4, 7-9; Isaiah 14:12-17; Ezekiel 28:11-19.)
- Satan tempted. (Genesis 3:1-5; James 1:13-15; 1 Corinthians 11:3; John 8:44; Matthew 4:1-11; 1 John 2:16.)
- Adam and Eve Ate. (Genesis 3:6; 1 John 2:15-17; John 3:18; Romans 9:32; Hebrews 3:12-19.)

The Results of Sin

- Realization. Genesis 3:7.
- Shame. Genesis 3:7-9.
- Disconnection. From God, Genesis 3:8-9. From one another, Genesis 3:7, 12, 16b.
- Blame. Genesis 3:12-13.
- Blaming: Adam —>> Eve —>> Serpent
- Curses: Serpent —>> Eve —>> Adam

God's Responses to Sin

- War: Genesis 3:15; Job 1-2, 38-42; John 8:44, 10:10; Genesis 50:20; Romans 8:28; Ephesians 6:10-20.
- Pain in Childbearing. Genesis 3:16; 1 Timothy 2:8-15.

- Disorder in the Family. Genesis 3:16; Ephesians 5:21-6:4.
- Drudgery in Work. Genesis 3:17-19
- Death. Genesis 3:19, 2:17; Romans 5:12-21.
- The Gospel. Genesis 3:15; Hebrews 2:14, 11; Revelation 20.
- The Gospel Sign. Genesis 3:21; Hebrews 9:22; Ephesians 1:7; Romans 3:20, 8:1-3.
- God provided. Genesis 22:8; Romans 3:20.
- A sacrifice was made. Hebrews 9:22, 10:4; Ephesians 1:7.
- Banishment. Genesis 3:22-24; Revelation 22:2.

Applications

- Think about how the fall of mankind and the curses of Genesis 3 perfectly explain the condition of our world today.
- Salvation is an act of God. Do not look around at the world for solutions.
- Share the gospel. Be able to explain this to others by connecting the brokenness of the world with our own brokenness. Then show them God's solution — Jesus Christ.
- Understand how the faithful in the Old Testament were saved. (See Hebrews 11; Galatians 3:1-14; for help.)
