Mark 7:24-30

From Enemies to Beloved Children

Jesus Is the King of All Nations.

Jesus Is the King of All Nations.
1. Jesus Came Specifically for His People Israel (24-27).
2. A Gentile Exhibits Faith His People Should Have (28-30).

3. Jesus Came for Israel to Bless All the Nations (Rev 4-5).

Conclusion: How can it be that Jesus would die for His enemies like us?! If we see that we have no more to commend us to God than did this Syrophoenician woman, we will begin to see the radical forgiveness inherent to the gospel of Jesus Christ. If God is this committed to reaching all the nations, should all His people, so radically loved, be too?

Genesis 12:1-3

Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

Genesis 22:15-18

And the angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time from heaven and said, "By myself I have sworn, declares the LORD, because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, I will surely bless you, and I will surely multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. And your offspring shall possess the gate of his enemies, and in your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice."

Genesis 26:3-5

Sojourn in this land, and I will be with you and will bless you, for to you and to your offspring I will give all these lands, and *I will establish the oath that I swore to Abraham your father*. I will multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and will give to your offspring all these lands. And *in your offspring all the nations of the earth shall be blessed*, because Abraham obeyed my voice and kept my charge, my commandments, my statutes, and my laws."

Psalm 22:27-28

All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD, and *all the families of the nations* shall worship before you. For kingship belongs to the Lord, and he rules over the nations.

Philippians 2:5-18

Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Revelation 5:9-10

Taking Gathered Worship Home

Imagine an enemy whose family has loathed you for generations. They have slaughtered your people and mocked your God. They have derided "your kind" for millennia. As people who mostly don't even know our great-grandparents, let alone who hated them, this can be difficult for us to grasp. But the gospel transcends not just current hostilities, but those that have burned from before our memories. This is *the power of God's love*.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday

READ Mark 7:24-30; Genesis 12:1-3; 22:15-18; 26:3-5; Psalm 22:27-28; Philippians 2:5-18; Revelation 5:9-10. DISCUSS What is the significance of Christ's interaction with this woman? How is it connected with God's promises? How does this impact your life? SERVE someone in need. MEDITATE on Revelation 17:14. PRAY "Jesus, You will be worshipped by a throng of those from all tribes, tongues, and nations! Please allow our praise of Your mercy to be joyfully given."

Monday

READ Mark 7:24-30; Genesis 12:1-3; 22:15-18; 26:3-5. DISCUSS How did the nations factor into the promises of God to Abraham? Why is this significant to understanding Mark's Gospel? MEDITATE on **Revelation 17:14**. PRAY, "Lord, *You are faithful in all Your promises*. You have done and will do all that You have said. We praise You!"

Tuesday

READ Mark 7:24-30; Genesis 12:1-3; Psalm 22:27-28. DISCUSS How does this Psalm anticipate and delight in God's fulfillment of His promise to Abram? How does that promise relate to you? How should this affect the way we live now? SERVE by considering someone else's needs *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Revelation 17:14**. PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for loving enemies *like us* and making us into Your beloved siblings. Teach us to walk in Your ways, to love others as You love us."

Wednesday

READ 7:24-30; Genesis 22:15-18; Philippians 2:5-18; Revelation 5:9-10. DISCUSS How does the Syrophoenician woman's approach to Jesus demonstrate the humility we are called to in Philippians? How are you repenting of your presumption in approaching Christ? MEDITATE on Revelation 17:14. PRAY, "Lord, thank You for Your great patience with us. Enable us to humble ourselves to approach You as we should. Receive our worship in Your holy name."

Thursday

READ Mark 7:24-30; Genesis 26:3-5; Revelation 5:9-10. DISCUSS Abraham received so much from God. What about you? How are you obeying Christ because of His goodness to you? SERVE by demonstrating God's tenderness! MEDITATE on Revelation 17:14. PRAY, "Jesus, we can never thank You adequately."

Friday

READ Mark 7:24-30; Genesis 12:1-3; 22:15-18; 26:3-5; Psalm 22:27-28; Philippians 2:5-18; Revelation 5:9-10. DISCUSS How has the Holy Spirit been guiding you *this week through these passages*? MEDITATE on Revelation 17:14. PRAY that we at FCCW would *be made more and more holy with Christ*.

Saturday

PREPARE for gathered worship tomorrow. READ Mark 7:1-37. Invite others to join you tomorrow and remember the new 10:30 time for the worship service. Ask Jesus to meet us and transform us together.
