



“God’s Sovereignty”

Lessons from History
Deuteronomy 11:1-12

It’s found in the:

I. Love –“love the Lord...keep His charge” (vs. 1-3)

A love that has an:

- A. Expectation** – “Therefore thou shalt love the Lord thy God”
- B. Extraction** – “His mighty hand and outstretched arm”
- C. Exhibition** - “His miracles...which He did in the midst of Egypt”

II. Lore –“your eyes have seen all the great acts of the Lord” (vs. 4-7)

A lore that tells us He:

- A. Conquers** - “what He did unto the army of Egypt”
- B. Chastises** –“What the Lord did unto you in the wilderness”
- C. Calls** –“What He did unto Dathan and Abiram”

III. Land – “a land that flows with milk and honey” (vs. 8-12)

A land where He controls the:

- A. Possession** – “that ye may...go in and possess the land”
- B. Prolonging** –“that ye may prolong your days in the land”
- C. Precipitation** –“drinks water from the rain of heaven”
