

“Blessing after Desolation” (Haggai 2:10–23)

Introduction (Zechariah 1:1–6; Haggai 1:2–11)

**Big Idea: Upon their repentance, God would now replace his people’s desolation with blessing.**

I. Haggai’s Two Oracles on the Same Day

- a. The covenant people’s curses will be replaced with blessings. (verses 10–19)

Deuteronomy 28:15, 22; Amos 4:9; Proverbs 3:9–10

- b. The covenant dynasty’s rejection will be replaced with vindication. (verses 20–23)

- a. Spiritual impurity will surely defile God’s people and their efforts.

- c. David’s royal Son will surely be exalted amid world-shaking events.
