

The Lord's Chastisement at the Lord's Supper 1 Corinthians 11:27–34

The Holy Spirit warns those at the Lord's Supper not to eat and drink in an unworthy manner.

- Taking the Lord's Supper unworthily would be taking the Lord's Supper in a way that violated the meaning (doctrinal truths) and purpose (relational truths) of the Lord's Supper.
- To be guilty of the Lord's body and blood is to be held liable as if you were the very one who
 unjustly put the Lord to death.

Only through self-examination can an unworthy person eat the Lord's Supper worthily.

- To examine oneself is to put to the test one's own understanding of the meaning of the Lord's Supper, faith in Christ, and relationship with Christ and His church.
- The purpose of the self-examination is to place ourself under the chastisement of the Lord so that we may eat the Lord's Supper without judgment (32).

For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.

- It's best to understand the reference to body not as the church/body but as a simple summary of both the body and blood of Christ upon the cross sacrificed for us.
- Because unworthily partaking the Lord's Supper, by not properly understanding the truths of the Lord's sacrifice, will incur the consequence of God's disapproval (32).

For this reason many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep.

- The Lord disciplines His own people (Nadab and Abihu, Moses, Uzzah, David and the child of Bathsheba, King Uzziah, Ananias and Sapphira).
- The Lord chastises His children through physical, emotional, and spiritual pain and anguish, and
 even death James 5:13–20; 1 Corinthians 5:5; Psalm 38:3–4 There is no soundness in my flesh
 Because of Your anger, Nor any health in my bones Because of my sin. For my iniquities have
 gone over my head; Like a heavy burden they are too heavy for me.

For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged.

- We must discern our own heart and actions before the Lord.
- The process of self-examination can be painful Proverbs 20:30 Blows that hurt cleanse away evil, As do stripes the inner depths of the heart.

But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, that we may not be condemned with the world.

- The Lord disciplines His children because He loves His children Hebrews 12:6 for whom the Lord loves He chastens, and scourges every son whom He receives.
- Believers are willing to endure the temporary discipline of the Lord to avoid the wrath and condemnation of an eternal punishment in the lake of fire.

The Lord will be sympathetic with our confession of sin - Hebrews 4:15–16 For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.
