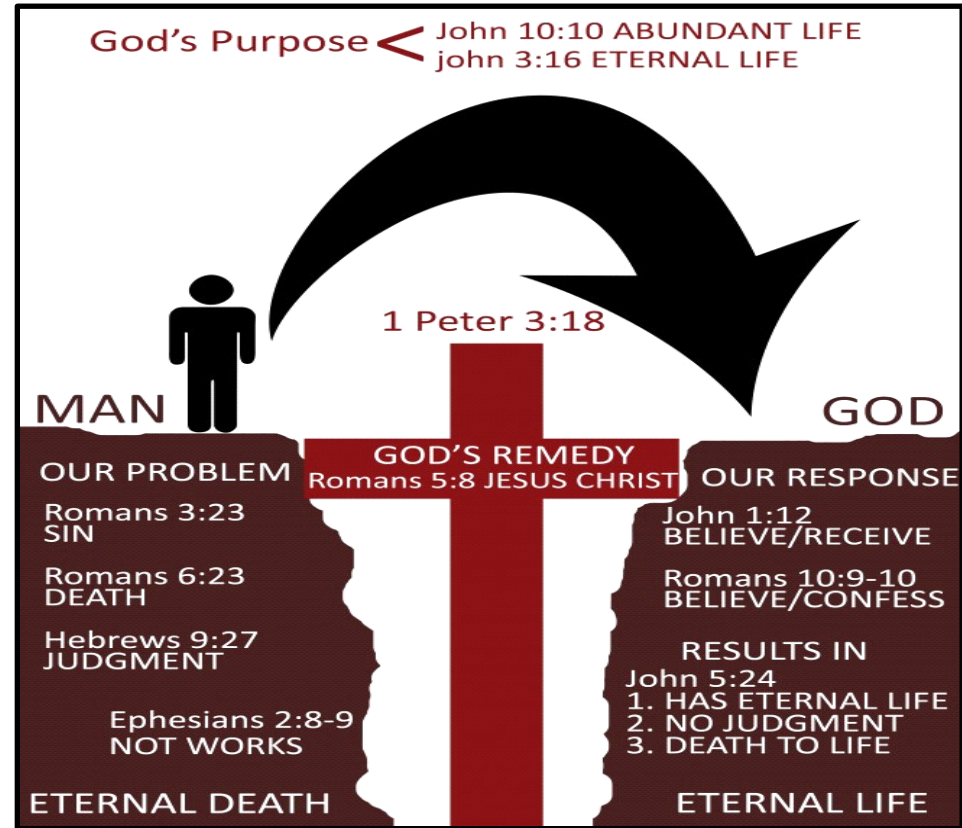

David's Sin
2 Samuel 11:1–27

Sin ruined David - **1 Kings 15:5** because **David did what was right in the eyes of the LORD, and had not turned aside from anything that He commanded him all the days of his life, except in the matter of Uriah the Hittite.**

David was tempted.

v. 1 - David was not where he was supposed to be.

v. 2 - David was drawn away by lust - **James 1:14** **But each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed.**

v. 3 - David did not turn from temptation.

- Bathsheba was the daughter of one of David's mighty men - **2 Samuel 23:34**
- Bathsheba was the granddaughter of David's most trusted counselor - **2 Samuel 16:23**
Now the advice of Ahithophel, which he gave in those days, was as if one had inquired at the oracle of God.
- Bathsheba was the wife of Uriah the Hittite - **2 Samuel 23:39**
- **Proverbs 7:6–9** - Four problems: 1) He's among the simple. 2) He's lacking sense. 3) he's in the wrong place. 4) He's there at the worst time.
- I can't be haphazardly avoiding sin. It has to be my purpose (*Luke Balman*).

David sinned.

v. 4–5 - David committed adultery - **Exodus 20:14** **You shall not commit adultery.**

- Because of her ceremonial cleansing, David knew she was not pregnant and that she was likely to become pregnant (Lev 15:19), therefore, the child was his child.

David covered his sin.

v. 6–8 - David attempted to make it look like Bathsheba was pregnant with Uriah's child.

v. 9–13 - Uriah showed more integrity and faithfulness to the Lord than David.

- Uriah was keeping himself in a state of ritual purity because he was faithful in following King David in fighting the Lord's battles - **1 Samuel 21:4–6**
- Uriah saw his military service as service to the Lord and for the Lord.

v. 14–25 - David murdered Uriah.

- David abused his power and authority.
- David committed a sin deserving of death - **Leviticus 20:10** **The man who commits adultery with another man's wife, he who commits adultery with his neighbor's wife, the adulterer and the adulteress, shall surely be put to death.**
- David chose to have Uriah put to death instead of confessing his sin and accepting the death penalty himself.
- David blamed God for Uriah's death.

v. 26–27b - David lied and made himself look noble because he married Uriah's widow.

But the thing that David had done displeased (was evil in the sight of) the LORD.

- David refused to see the evil in what he did, and hid the evil from others (25).
- But David could not hide the evil from eyes of the Lord.

Brother and sister, we have only one hero in God's word, the Lord Jesus Christ.
