Inscription: Maschil of David; A Prayer when he was in the cave.

<u>Poetical Structure:</u> Inverted Parallelism (v. 1); Irregular Parallelism

Poetical Layout

- I cried unto the Lord with my voice;
 With my voice unto the Lord did I make my supplication.
- I poured out my complaint before him;
 I shewed before him my trouble.
- When my spirit was overwhelmed within me, Then thou knewest my path. In the way wherein I walked Have they privily laid a snare for me.
- 4) I looked on my right hand, and beheld, But there was no man that would know me: Refuge failed me; No man cared for my soul.

- I cried unto thee, O Lord:
 I said,
 Thou art my refuge
 And my portion in the land of the living.
- 6) Attend unto my cry; For I am brought very low: Deliver me from my persecutors; For they are stronger than I.
- 7) Bring my soul out of prison,
 That I may praise thy name:
 The righteous shall compass me about;
 For thou shalt deal bountifully with me.

Attend - listen attentively, be alert
