BOOKS PURPOSE: Proverbs 1:2–7 (NKJV)

THREE ACTIONS

- **2** To **know** wisdom and instruction, To **perceive** the words of understanding,
- **3** To **receive** the instruction of wisdom, Justice, judgment, and equity;

THREE INDIVIDUALS

- **4** To give prudence to the **simple**, To the **young man** knowledge and discretion—
- **5** A **wise man** will <u>hear</u> and <u>increase</u> learning, And a man of understanding <u>will attain</u> wise counsel,
- **6** To understand a proverb and an enigma, The words of the wise and their riddles.

SINGLE THEME

7 The **fear of the LORD** is the beginning of <u>knowledge</u>, But fools despise <u>wisdom and instruction</u>.




- "A Statement of comparison/summary of a common experience"
- Wisdom/Illustration for Others: A Nation can be a Proverb
 - 1 Kings 9:7 (NKJV) then I will cut off Israel from the land which I have given them; and this house which I have consecrated for My name I will cast out of My sight. Israel will be a proverb and a byword among all peoples.
- Prophetic Use
 - Isaiah 14:4 (NKJV) that you will take up this proverb against the king of Babylon, and say: "How the oppressor has ceased, The golden city ceased!
- Connected to Wisdom Speech
 - Job 27:1 (NKJV) Moreover Job continued his discourse, and said:



















NOTE: look for simile (like) (I like Smiles)

A Declaration that 1 Thing resembles another/Comparison by Resemblance

NOTE: look for metaphor (is /metamorphosis into something else)

A Declaration that 1 Thing is (represents) another/Comparison by Representation

Comparison between two things that are not alike

Similes differ from metaphors by having an identifiable indicator of resemblance.

Simile (explicit indicator): This rainbow trout glistens like fire. (color)

Metaphor (no explicit indicator): The fish is a stroke of lightning. (speed)

PARALLELISM & EMBLEMATIC (SYMBOLIC)

Proverbs 16:24 (Simile)

24 Pleasant words are like a honeycomb, Sweetness to the soul and health to the bones.

INDICATOR (given): look for the indicator given in the text that applies to both (sweetness)


Proverbs 10:15 (Metaphor)

15 The wealth of a rich person is a fortified city, but the poor are brought to ruin by their poverty.

INDICATOR (not given): look for the indicator that both images have in common (fortification/protection vs. no protection)


NOTE: focus on the comparison word (honeycomb, fortified city)

STEP 4 – DEEPEN YOUR UNDERSTANDING WITH WORD STUDY

WISDOM - 51x (NKJV), 7 DIFFERENT UNDERLYING HEBREW WORDS

- 1. (תְּבְּמְה) | 38X (ḥāṣ̞ mā(h)), technical skill/mastery, aptitude, experience, good sense, wisdom (skilled living & wisdom) Truth applied
- 2. (חֲבְמוֹת) | 3X (ḥāk·môt) Wisdom (personified)
- 3. (בֶּב) | 3X (lēḇ) Normally referring to the inside, heart/mind (heart/mind and wisdom)
- 4. (תּוֹשִׁיָּה) | 3x (tû ·šiy ·yā(h)) prudence, sound judgment (thinking/decision & wisdom)
- 5. (שַּׁבֶּל) 2x | (śĕ ·kĕl) insight, intelligence from the mouth (mouth and wisdom)
- 6. (กิฐ) 1x | (pě(h)) mouth, opening, declaration
- 7. (שַׂבֵל) 1x | (śā ·k̞ձl) Understanding, wisdom, discretion (experience & wisdom)






STAGE 4 – GENTLY EXHORT


Proverbs 4:1-2 (NKJV)




18 Chasten your son while there is hope, And do not set your heart on his destruction.
