The Urgency of Drawing Near to God Via His Means

Tuesday, September 24, 2024 - Read Psalm 119:145-152

Questions from the Scripture text: What does the psalmist do (v145a)? With how much of his heart? What does he ask (v145b)? What does he promise to do? To Whom does he cry (v146a)? What does He ask the Lord to do (v146b)? So that he may do what? When does he do this crying (v147a—b)? Why does he do this (v147c)? When else is he doing what (v148)? To what attributes of God does he appeal (v149)? What two things does he ask God to do? Who have drawn near to him (v150a)? What is their condition (v150b)? Who else is near (v151a)? And what is His character and command like (v151b)? What has the psalmist known from of old (v152)?

How do we combat the nearness of the wicked? Psalm 119:145–152 looks forward to opening portion of morning public worship on the coming Lord's Day. In these eight verses of Holy Scripture, the Holy Spirit teaches us that we are to seek the nearness of the Lord by prayer and the ministry of the Word.

<u>Urgency</u>. The believer ought to feel his desperate need for the Lord. This stanza's verses all begin with the letter that begins the root for crying out (v145, 146), the root for waking up (v147, 148), and the root for near (v150–151). These words are skillfully arranged into a stanza in which the psalmist's urgency is expressed both in his crying out (v145–146) and in how he rises both before first light (v147) and first thing in the morning (v148).

<u>Nearness</u>. Why is he so urgent that the Lord Himself be near (v151)? Because those who follow after evil are already near (v150). As Prov 1:8–33 instructs, we need God Himself, by His Word, to draw us near, so that we will not be tempted into the wickedness of those around us.

Means: prayer and the Word. So, what is he waking up to do, in order to seek the Lord? To meditate upon His Word (v148b, cf. v147). Many a believer has longed for God to be near. When you long for Him, learn from this stanza to seek Him by prayer (v145–146) and the Word!

How has wickedness come near in a way that threatens you? That tempts you? What use are you making of prayer and the Word?

Sample prayer: O Lord, we cry out to You with our whole heart. We rise and cry to you to give us life. In Your steadfast love and justice, give us life. Make us to know You through Your word, we ask through Christ, AMEN!
