



Insight into today's church and our culture

1st century Corinthian aberrations –

Are a mirror before the 21st century church –

The solution for both is Christ the wisdom and power of God

1 Corinthians 1:1-3 (ESV)

- ¹ Paul, called by the will of God to be an apostle of Christ Jesus, and our brother Sosthenes,
- ² To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together with all those who in every place call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours:
- ³ Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

• Paul, the writer, identifies himself as an apostle of Christ commissioned by God, along with his companion, Sosthenes. He is writing to the assembly of believers in Corinth who have also been commissioned and set apart by God for holiness and service to Christ, as are all believers everywhere who likewise call on the Lord. He wishes upon them God's continued gracious dealings and spiritual prosperity that come from both God and the Lord Jesus Christ.
