Follow-Up Quote

"Verses 42-44 are not a promise that Yahweh will without exception supply believers with daily bread in all circumstances, natural as such a generalization may seem. Rather the text is simply teaching that whatever Yahweh promises will be so. Food is brought, but it is not enough, but Yahweh says it will be more than enough. If Yahweh says that what is deficient will be sufficient, even abundant, the it will be so. Second Kings 4 puts me back in the Deuteronomy 8:3 situation. It doesn't guarantee me immunity from need or even starvation. Rather it means that I stand beside the manna-seeking Israelite that Wednesday morning and say, 'I will eat today, if I eat, because Yahweh has decided that I will have enough.'"
