1.	to	As Christians fight the good fight of faith, they seek to honor the Lord with good works in every aspect of their lives which includes their life as a citizen.	
	a.	Christian citizens give attention to and thanksgiving in regards to the "ministers of God" who serve as civil magistrates.	
	b.	Christian citizens should vote for those magistrates who will govern in such a way that order and justice is maintained so they can live lives.

	C.	Christian citizens should vote for those magistrates who will govern in such a way that believers are free to pursue exalting godliness in all areas of life.	
		lagistrates were appointed by God for the protection of as well as the peace and decency society." - John Calvin	

2.	When there are few truly qualified people to vote for there are several things believers should consider.	
	a. Consider if there are candidates who meet	
	of the qualifications though they fail in others.	
	b. Consider which candidates are most likely to allow believers to live lives and be free to share the gospel.	
	c. Consider that elections are often more important than national elections.	
	d. Actively support those " magistrates" who are willing to challenge magistrates in a higher position to do what is right and good.
