Question #14:

Why do you use only the King James Bible?

Answer:

It's the only English Bible completely translated from the original texts.

Explanation:

Hundreds of English versions of the Bible have been written since the 1970s. The KJB is the still the only Bible in the English language that is totally translated from the Masoretic Text of the Hebrew Old Testament, and the Majority Text (aka "Received Text" or "Textus Receptus") of the New Testament.

Brook Wescott and Fenton Hort were two false prophets that rewrote the Greek New Testament (from 1853-1881). Their 28-year project, the "New Testament in the Original Greek" has been used as the primary source for all the English versions that have come since. It is horrible what they did to the New Testament. Wescott and Hort are the main reason why the New International Version has 66,000 less words than the KJB.
