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Question #2: **Has Jesus always existed?**

Key verse:

Micah 5:2, "But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting."

The prophet Micah said this in about 710B.C. Whoever Micah was talking about would be from of _____ and from _____. He would come to earth through the town of _____.

Explanation:

When Herod was looking for the Christ child, the prophet Micah was quoted to him by the chief priests and scribes as confirmation of where Christ would come into the world (see **Matthew 2:3-6**). Jesus Christ was the fulfillment of this prophecy, thus Jesus Christ is from everlasting.

Melchizedek (**Genesis 14** and **Hebrews 7**) is always considered a "type" (or manifestation) of Christ. How is He described in **Hebrews 7:3**? As "having neither _____ of days, nor _____ of life."
